What to expect from your free telehealth environmental health registry evaluation



Connect to a VET-HOME clinician via telehealth from the convenience of your home



Discuss your history of military environmental exposures and any related symptoms or concerns



Review your physical exam of record with your VET-HOME clinician



Visit your nearest VA facility for any recommended diagnostic tests



Receive a follow-up letter about your visit with copies of your test results and any additional recommendations

Your evaluation and exposure history will be documented in your VA health record.
